What will we be doing today?


We will be recreating Vincent van Gogh's Sunflower picture as a collage!

Recap: What is a collage?

A collage is piece of art in which you put different pictures in a certain way. You can use different pictures from materials such as magazines, newspapers, recyclable materials and fabric.




YOU WILL NEED

- An A4 plain paper
- A pencil
- A rubber
- Magazines/newspapers/fabric/recyclable materials
- Paint/colouring pencils/felt-tip pens/crayons
- Scissors (! **Always use with adult supervision**)
- A glue stick


EXPLANATION OF TASK

Turn your A4 plain paper to portrait.



Draw a pot using a pencil at the bottom of the page to fill nearly half of the page.


EXPLANATION OF TASK

Draw the small stems, big leaves and the sun flowers.
(Make sure the sunflowers have big petals).

EXPLANATION OF TASK


Cut out coloured parts of newspapers, magazines or fabric to match the colour of the parts of the sunflower. E.g. Green for the leaves and stem and yellow for the petals.

If you cannot find a certain colour for a part, then you can use colours or paint to paint those parts.

If you wish, you can paint or colour your background.

Glue the cut-up pieces onto the parts of the flower.
