- Caring means showing kindness to those around you and there are many different ways you can care for people and their community.
- Caring can also mean looking after things that are important such as recycling or picking up rubbish from the floor.
- You can also show care by listening to others. Listening helps others know that you are paying attention and that you care about them.
- For Buddhists, the story of "The Monkey King" shows how the Monkey King made a sacrifice by saving his tribe from being killed by the king. From this story we can see that the monkey king was willing to do all it took to look after and care for his species.
- For Sikhs, Guru Nanak Dev Ji created the langar because he believed in equality. That means everyone is equal and should be treated the same. Each Gurdwara has a langar where everyone meets to cook and serve the meal.
- For Muslims, the story "be my guest" shows how Abdul cared for an old man by putting the old man's needs before the needs of himself and his family. Abdul took it upon himself to prepare a meal for his family to save the visitor from feeling sad.
