Dear Parents/Carers,

At Wembley Primary it is important that our children also have their views heard. Leaders across the school regularly ask the children about their opinions on their learning. This is an important part of our school self-evaluation. In addition we have student bodies such as the School Council and our newly formed Eco Council. These groups meet regularly to work with Miss Benjamin (School Council) and Miss Macaulay (Eco Council) to make decisions and suggest improvements.

This half term has been very busy! The children have enjoyed reading traditional tales such as King Jack and the Dragon and they learnt how to make lots of fantastic dens.




For Goldilocks and the Three Bears, children voted for their favourite breakfast options from toast, cereal and porridge and then they got to try them!
