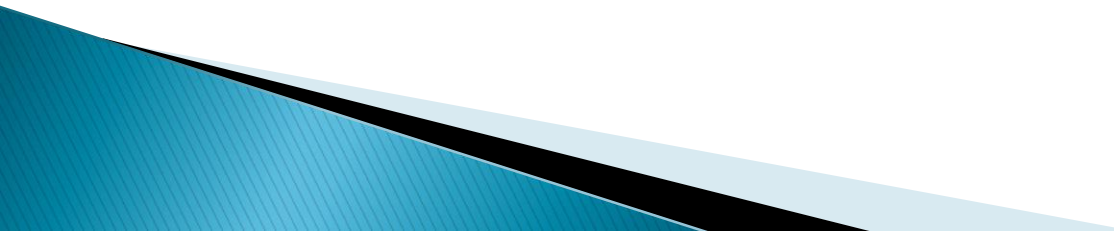

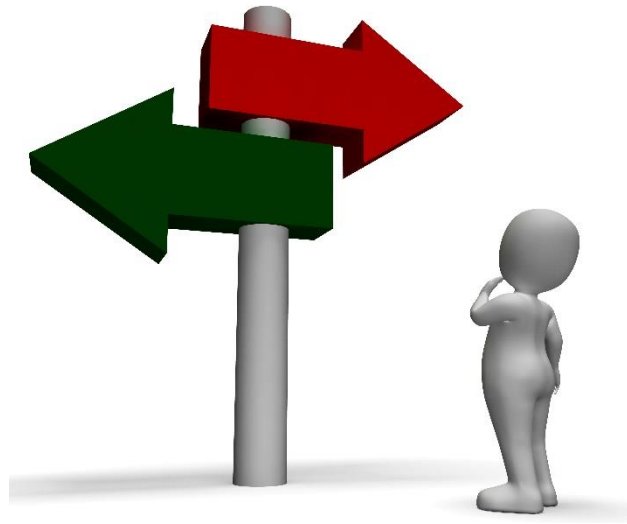

# What is a dilemma?

- ▶ A situation where a difficult choice has to be made. There might be no 'good' choice where everyone is happy.



Planning

from our example from yesterday.

What leads to the dilemma?

Iron Man has been seen as a villain as he was eating metal, damaging farms, etc but the farmers were not aware that was his diet, and he wasn't there to harm anyone.

Dilemma:

Iron Man meets Iron Giant, but needs to change the world to realise that actually Iron man is a hero, not a villain. He needs to set the record straight.

What happens?

They give each other a series of challenges, and Iron Man is to prove that he is a hero. Iron Man saves the world from the giant, and proves he is the hero, and the Iron giant is a villain. The villain then wants to be liked by the world, so he changes and befriends the Iron Man, and they together they both defeat the ferocious dragon


What is the choice made

Iron man saves the world by defeating Iron giant, and actually getting him to change.
