The next few slides are designed to help you with this.

Here is an example of a timetable used by schools such as Preston Manor.

You will notice there are two of them.

The top one is week 1

The bottom is week 2

Week 1 – goes first, then you will move onto week 2. Once week 2 is complete, you return to Week 1 and it continues like that for the rest of the year.

You will notice down the front the numbers 1-6. These are the periods, in Preston Manor for example the times of the periods are as follows:


The Letter and Numbers refer to the room your lesson is taking place in. You should be given a map of the school when you arrive, however, if you are not sure where something is ask an adult or one of the older children.

Remember your timetable may look slight different from this, but they will explain it to you when you get it.

Bus or train timetables

For example, If I was going to Kingsbury High, and lived near Preston Road, I might get the 204 to school. This shows what time the bus leaves from outside Preston Road Station

However, I can't plan my journey yet as I don't know what time it arrives.



Bus timetables

So I need to look at the bus timetable (I'm using the TFL website to get this information – to find it type TFL bus timetables into google)




Now, I know my nearest stop to Kingsbury High is Kingsbury Circle, looking at the timetable its now clear to see its 6 minute journey between the two stops.

However, this is probably with no traffic, so I would allow myself 10 minutes for the bus, then there is a short walk at the end. So my journey would be about 20 minutes for my journey in total.

Now use both of these to help. If I wanted to be at school for 8.30, with a 20 minute journey, ideally I want to be on the bus at 8.10. However, there is a bus at 8.12. But if that is late I'm going to be late to school. Therefore, I'd be aiming for the 7.57 which would get me to school for about 20 past.



Things to remember when travelling

- Always check your journey before you leave to make sure there are no road closures or temporary traffic lights which may slow your journey down.
- Leave with plenty of time to get your bus, you do not want to be running after the bus first thing in the morning, or being late.
- There are apps you can get that will give you up to date arrivals of public transport such as **citymapper**.

Equipment and Enrichment

Before starting your new high school you will be given a list of essential equipment that you will need in order to be ready for the new academic year. Most schools will provide you with a letter detailing this, as well as a Year 7 Handbook on or before you start. Make sure you read through these carefully, they often tell you the 'Do's and Don'ts' of high schools and will give you an idea of what to expect.

In these handbooks there will also be some idea of enrichment activities you can get involved in after school, most schools have a diverse list and they are quite extensive and fit most interests. It is not mandatory you sign up to them, but they are usually quite fun and a great way of making new friends.

The next two slides detail examples of both lists to give you an idea of what equipment you need and activities you can get involved in.
