

# L.O: To draw a floor plan.


## Key Vocabulary

**Architect:** A person who designs buildings.

**Birds eye view:** A view from above.



**Floor plan:** A **diagram** of the relationships between rooms, spaces and other physical features at one level of a structure. It maps out features of the building and allows you to see what each room is used for. Similar to a **map**, the orientation of the view is downward from above.




**Locate:** To find the exact place or position of Something.





# What has been drawn on the map?


There is no key for this map, so it might be tricky to know what has been drawn. Below I have labelled the map to help you understand what each thing is.

**What rooms do you think have been drawn?**



What rooms do you think have been drawn?

This is a plan of only the first floor of the house. We cannot see what is on the second floor.



What rooms will you include in your plan?

Here is another example of a floor plan.

**Which rooms are on this floor?**

You might have noticed this map does not include the street around the house.



When drawing your map, it's a good idea to first draw all the walls of all the rooms. Then add more detail to your maps. Watch this video for an example:
