

### Maths

We will be beginning the term with using multiplication facts from the 2,3,4,5,8 and 10 timetable. We will then be learning to add and subtract three digit number to ones, tens and hundreds. In geometry we will be focusing on properties of 2D shapes. All maths is taught with a focus on problem-solving and children being able to explain their understanding of methods they have used.

### Literacy

In Literacy we will begin the term with performance poetry and then follow with information text writing. Children will be learning how to write and perform a poem. They will also create information posters and leaflets. *See if you have any information texts at home (newspapers, recipe books, non-fiction texts). Discuss the layout with your child e.g. headings, sub headings, font types, pictures etc.*

Spelling and handwriting will be taught explicitly and it is important that children develop accuracy in both areas.

### History

This half-term children in Year 3 will be learning about Roman Britain as their History topic. They will be focusing on the day to day lives of the Romans and their relationships with the Celts.

### Science

This half term children will be learning about 'Plants'. In this unit the children will be learning about what plants need to grow. This will include practical investigations and research.

Children will make predictions, collect evidence, plan a fair test and make and record measurements. They will use their results to make comparisons, draw and explain conclusions.

Children will be learning simple phrases, questions and responses. They will be playing Spanish games, counting and learning



## Literacy




Write a poem for the NHS staff thanking them for all their hard work. Perform it if you can and send us your video.
