Literacy

Children will be:

- *learning about non-fiction and fiction text.
- *identifying the features of a non-chronological report.
- *writing a non-chronological report.
- *learning imperative verbs.
- *identifying the features of instructions.
- *Writing a set of instructions.

How can you help your child at home?

In order to help your child at home, you can encourage them to practise their handwriting and learn the Year 1 common exception words/ high frequency words which will be sent home.

Science

This half-term we will be learning about animals. Children will be learning to group animals into 5 different groups such as mammals, fish, amphibians, reptiles and birds. They also learn to classify and name different animals.

Digital writing:




Year 1 Topic Home Learning Summer 1

- *Colour/material





Literacy-Stories
