Key Facts

- The Vikings came from Norway, Sweden and Denmark.
- They invaded Russia, Iceland and Northern France.
- They travelled over the sea in longships, which are long, narrow wooden boats that could be sailed in both deep and shallow water.
- The Vikings left their homeland because they were looking for money as well as better land to farm on.
- Vikings were farmers. They planted vegetables and kept animals.
- The Vikings first attacked Britain in 787 CE, but didn't start to invade and settle here until 793 CE.
- Viking warriors fought using long swords and axes.
- Vikings traded items like honey, wheat, wool, wood and iron for goods like silver, silk, spices and jewellery.
- Vikings were Pagans.
- In 878 CE, **King Alfred the Great** defeated the Vikings in battle and gave them a part of England.
