Children have produced some fantastic pieces of writing in English, in reading we have been practising the skill evaluating and in Maths we developed our problem solving and reasoning skills. English

Reading skills, spelling, punctuation, grammar and handwriting will be covered throughout the topics. Poetry Children will explore poetry, with a focus on 'My Shadow' by Robert Louis Stevenson. They will deconstruct poems from a writer's perspective: inferring and identifying features of poetry performance, ultimately leading to a performance of the poem in front of parents/carers. 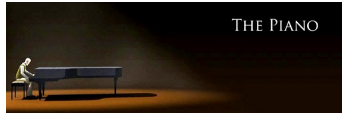


Science

We will be looking at 'Animals, including humans and Lifecycles'. This will involve looking at the reproductive cycle of plants. We will use our scientific skills: predicting, observing changes over time, researching and the presentation of data. Buying lilies (or other flowers) to dissect them at home will assist children in understanding all the plant parts we will explore. Children will also learn about the lifecycle of animals, including humans. They will learn about how they grow and develop. <https://www.bbc.com/bitesize/articles/>

Film Narrative

Pupils will study the emotive short film -



The Piano, by Aidan Gibbons. We will cover a variety of themes and skills including: prediction, telling a story, the use of empathy and adapting sentence construction. We will focus on how to create mood portrayed through the character.

Music

Pupils will learn about Melodic Composition, with a focus on form and structure.

Art

The children will be focusing on portraits this term and using paint and mixed media to experiment with a range of techniques for representing themselves artistically.

Computing

This unit looks at how a flat-file database can be used to organise and use data. Pupil will use search tools within a database to help them answer questions about the data. They will create graphs and charts from the data to help solve problems

Maths

In Maths, we will develop our understanding of decimals and percentages, looking at the relationship between the two, and how we can convert between them.

We will build this new knowledge on top of the great work we have already done with fractions.

Pupils need to learn equivalences between fractions, decimals and percentages e.g. $1/4 = 0.25 = 25\%$

Children can also improve their fluency with regular practice of number bonds, halving and doubling, division facts, square numbers using the website TopMarks.

RE and Worldviews

We will study the question: What happens when we die? We will explore the concepts of reincarnation and karma as well as continue to investigate other concepts relating to death.

History

This half term We will complete a local study of our great landmark 'Wembley Stadium'. We will learn the history of the stadium: its features and how it has changed over time. We will discover why the stadium was originally built and why it has been modernised.

P.E

We will focus on the 'Real PE scheme' where we will develop skills such as coordination and communication. These will support applying our skills to cricket.

PSHE

'Recipe for a Rights Respecting School', brilliant school

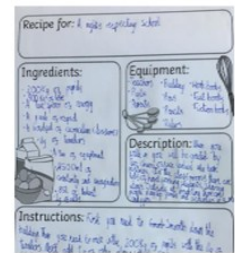
Create a 'Recipe for a Rights Respecting School', where all children are treated fairly.
