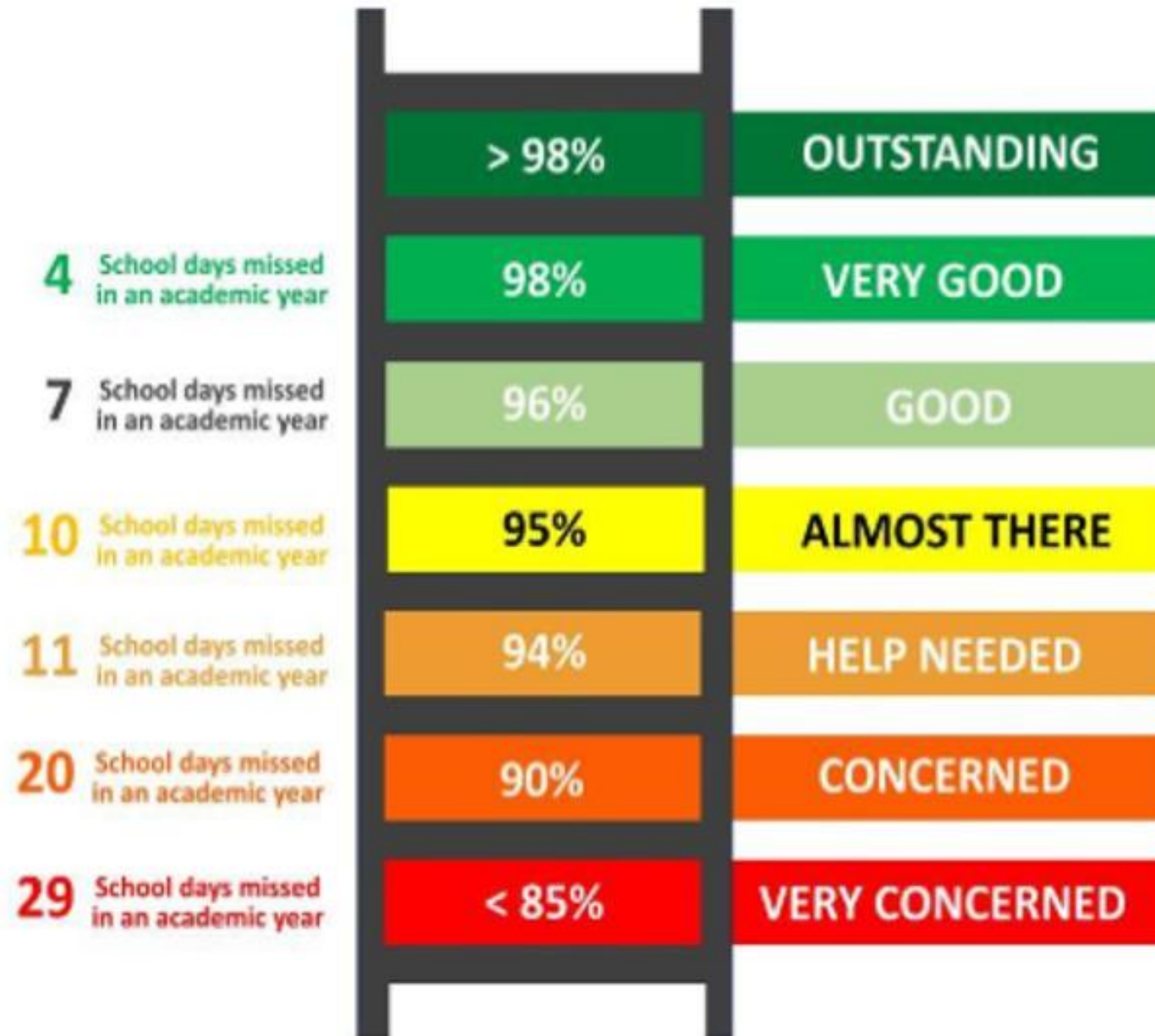
PE

Things your child needs to bring

- Please ensure all items are labelled.
- Bring a waterproof bag that can hold your home learning books (A4 size) and your reading book, which can fit on the back of your chair.
- You may bring a labelled water bottle from home.
- Reading book and reading record.
- Healthy snack for break time – fruit or vegetables – no crisps.





Every Day Matters

- We aim for all children to achieve attendance at 96% or above.
- 90% sounds good HOWEVER If at the end of the academic year if a child's attendance is at 90% it would mean that they would have missed a significant amount of learning.
- If a child misses 10% of a year of school, it means that they would have missed 20 days of education-around 95 lessons. This will clearly have an impact on the progress children make.
- If children do not attend school regularly, they may not be able to keep up with the learning. Children only get one chance at school, and a child's chance of a successful future may be affected by not attending school regularly.

Attendance and Punctuality

- It is vital that all children come to school every day and on time.
- Learning begins at 8:35.
- If you wish your child to walk home alone, please complete the form from the office and return it ASAP
- Please ensure you collect your children on time from the playground at 3:30.
- **If there are changes to who is picking your child up, you MUST inform the office. They will be given a password.**

Home Alone

- You need to ensure your child is confident to walk home on their own.
- Please encourage them to go straight home.
- They are not allowed to pick up younger siblings
- Please make sure they know if they are walking home, going to a club or being picked up.
- If you would like your child to meet you in the quad rather than picking them up from the playground you will need to complete the home alone letter – ensure you know where to meet them.

Reading

- Your child will be expected to read for at least 30 minutes every day. This should be a banded book.
- Your child needs to fill in their reading record every night with a summary of what they have read or any new vocabulary with definition they have acquired.
- Children's book bands are determined upon performance in class and on assessments. This may be different to the band your child had last year.

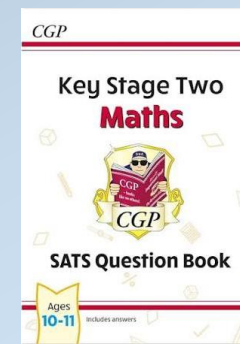
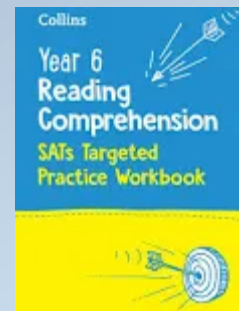

How can you help at home?

Practising KIRFs for just **5 minutes a day** can make a huge difference. Little and often is much more effective than longer practice sessions.

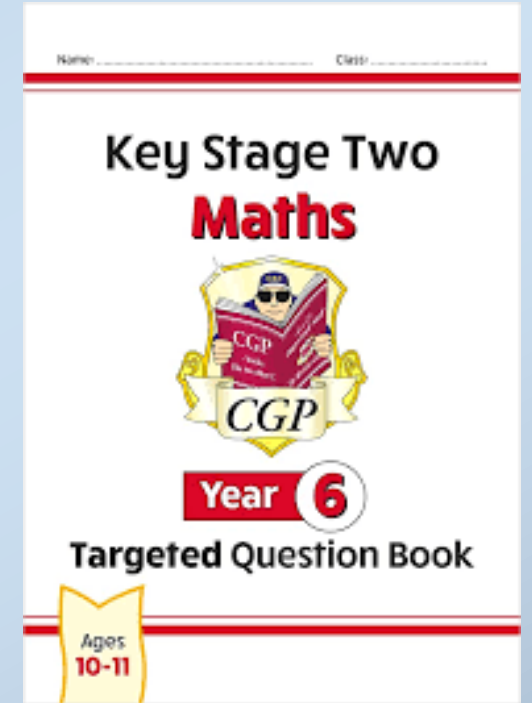

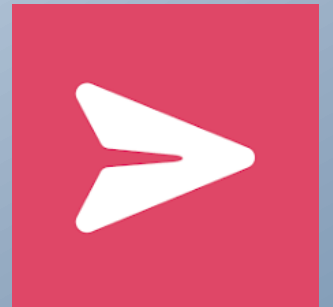

Amber

2 x warnings of low-level behaviour leading up to amber received.

Low level examples:

- Calling out
- Tapping of equipment
- Swinging on chair
- Disengaged from learning

Red

High-level behaviours resulting in an instant red:

- Physical related
- Deliberate disruptive
- Defiance
- Play fighting
- Amber already received and behaviour persists

Teacher to determine consequence for red e.g. missed play time.

3 x reds – letter sent to parents

5 x reds – meeting with SLT member

Purple

Racist incident
Homophobic incidents
Severe bullying

Immediate meeting with parents and child with member of SLT
Actions and consequences communicated.
Possible behaviour report

After-School Boosters

- If your child is chosen for an after-school booster (reading, maths or grammar) it is vital they attend.
- Invited clubs – you will receive a letter from a class teacher prior to other clubs becoming available. The cost of the club will be £15.00 and will run for 8 weeks or more dependent on the teacher.

After School Clubs

- If a space is available, children will be given their 1st choice club then removed from any additional preferences
- Waiting lists will be created if a club is over-subscribed and additional spaces if more adults are able to support. You will be contacted from the school office, if a place becomes available.

Trips

- A parent calendar of key dates will be released for each term
- We are planning trips to :
 - The National Gallery
 - Lion King Show (March 2027) - Approximately £25
 - Chessington (June/July) Approximately £31
- Some trips may need parent helpers. If you can help your child's teacher will let you know if you have been chosen.

Religion & Worldviews Trips

- Educational visits to places of worship are a fundamental **part of the curriculum**.
- Purpose = embed knowledge and deepen understanding.
- Children **WILL NOT BE ASKED TO PARTAKE IN ACTIVITIES SPECIFIC TO ANY RELIGION. (E.g. praying or worshipping).**
- Must speak to the Religion & Worldviews Lead (Ms. Williams) if you have any queries regarding a trip.

Online Safety

- Understand the risks but keep them in proportion.
- Communicate regularly – what are they doing, who are they talking to
- Ensure the apps they are using are age-appropriate.
- Develop strategies with you children
- You are the parent; having a device is a privilege not a right.

POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS APPS PARENTS / TEACHERS NEED TO KNOW ABOUT

THESE APPS CAN EASILY BE USED AS GROOMING TOOLS BY ONLINE PREDATORS LOOKING TO MEET UP & SEXUALLY ABUSE CHILDREN.

This is not exhaustive, and updated each year to reflect new risks and dangers (updated 2022). New apps are constantly being created, so it's important to monitor what children download.



FACEBOOK  Allows you to connect with others and share comments, photos and videos. You can add friends, write on people's pages and posts, join groups and play games.	SNAPCHAT  Is one of the most popular apps in recent years. Whilst the app promises that photo's, videos and stories disappear, others can take screenshots of private photo's.	INSTAGRAM  Kids are creating fake accounts to hide content from their parents, according to police. Messages are also deleted once a user leaves a conversation.
WHATSAPP  Allows you to send messages, images and videos in 121 and group chats with your contacts. You can choose to share your live location for up to eight hours with one contact or a group.	OMEGLE  Is a video chat website where users are matched randomly with strangers.	KIK MESSAGING KIK  Is a messaging app that allows content normally filtered on a home computer.
WHISPER  Is an anonymous social media app that promotes sharing personal secrets with strangers, (new people). It reveals a users location so people can meet up.	CALCULATOR %  Is only one of SEVERAL social media apps disguised as a calculator, the app is actually a secret photo vault to hide photos, videos, files and browser history.	HOT ON NOT  Strangers rate a user's 'attractiveness' with the aim of real-world meet ups in your local area.
ASK.FM  An app where users can anonymously ask questions and receive answers. The app has been featured in a number of cyber bullying cases.	YUBO  Similar to Tinder, the app is designed to allow teens to flirt with each other.	BURN BOOK  Anonymous rumors can be posted about people through audio messages, texts and photos.
WISHBONE  This app allows users to compare kids and rate them on a scale.	SKOUT  Is a location based dating app and website. Whilst people under 17 are unable to share private photo's, Children can easily create fake accounts.	MEET ME  Is a dating social media app that allows users to connect with people based on geographic proximity. The app encourages people to meet.
TELLOMYN  Anonymous messenger app. It calls itself "the most honest place on the internet." Age controls are inconsistent and sexual explicit material can be found.	Zoomerang  Is a popular app that looks like a harmless messaging app however it allows private anonymous messaging and is location enabled.	TIK TOK  Is one of the most popular apps in recent years used for sharing short videos with very limited privacy controls users are vulnerable to explicit material.
FACEBOOK MESSENGER  Is one of the most popular message apps in the world. It has already heavily been used by predators and the end-to-end encryption will make it even more unsafe.	BADOO  Is a location based dating app and website. Whilst people under 17 are unable to share private photo's, Children can easily create fake accounts.	KIDSCHAT  Is one of the most popular apps in recent years used for sharing short videos with very limited privacy controls users are vulnerable to explicit material.
VINE  Allows users to watch and post six second videos. While many of the videos are harmless, porn videos do pop up into the feed, exposing your children to sexually explicit material.	POOF  Hides other apps on your phone. If children have apps that they want to keep hidden from their parents, all they have to do is download this app and "poof," their screen is clear.	DISCORD  A gaming app that allows video sharing and video chat. Bullying is a problem on Discord. Some of the bigger problems include suicidal ideation, hate speech and graphic images.
HOOP  Hoop is a dating app that connects to SnapChat and allows 12+ teens to swipe on pictures that they like with the purpose of meeting. This leads to issues with fraud and sexual predators.	GALLERYVAULT  GalleryVault and other vault apps hide photos and videos. One of the scarier options on it gives the user access to a secret web browser and alerts the user if someone attempts to break into the app.	PSST!  Is a chat room app that prides itself on messages being deleted almost immediately from the server, ID-masking, and secretive private chat. For parents, these features are worrying.

Mobile Phone policy



- All Year 6 pupils must ensure their mobile phones are completely switched off when they enter the school and handed directly to the class teacher immediately upon arriving in the classroom.
- Devices will be held in secure storage throughout the school day and will be personally returned to the pupils by the teacher at dismissal time.
- Pupils are only permitted to turn their devices back on once they have fully departed the school grounds.
- If a pupil needs to notify a parent or guardian of their safe arrival at school, they must first request direct permission from the class teacher to use their device before handing it in.
- Only children walking home alone need to bring their phone to school.
- Smart Watches are not permissible
