Reading

 Children in Year 3 will be expected to read for at least 15-20 minutes every day. This should be a colour-banded book which is matched to their reading assessments.

• An adult needs to sign their child's reading record every night to show that they have read to an adult.

 Children's book bands are determined upon performance in class and on assessments. If children are reading below age related expectations, they may be reading a phonetically decodable book.

Making appointments to see your child's teacher

- If you need to discuss something brief with us please come and speak to us when you collect your child at the end of the day. If you are going to need a longer amount of time, then please arrange an appointment via the school office or with the teacher at collection time.
- Appointments with a class teacher in a morning need to be before 8:30am. Teachers are supervising pupils as of 8:35am.
- Updating you on your children's progress we will do this through our parents meeting and reports. If you have concerns then please do come and discuss with us.

After School Clubs

- If a space is available, children will be given their 1st choice club then removed from any additional preferences
- Waiting lists will be created if a club is over-subscribed and additional spaces if more adults are able to support. You will be contacted from the school office, if a place becomes available.
- Invited clubs you will receive a letter from a class teacher prior to clubs becoming available. This is a free club and will run for 8 weeks or more dependent on the teacher.

Trips

- A parent calendar of key dates will be released for each term
- Most trips will be linked to areas of the curriculum e.g. Science, History, Geography
- There will also be local trips eg. Library, Religious buildings, local area walks
- Curriculum trips will usually **incur a fee**. We try to keep the costs down and will usually use public transport to help with this.
- Parent volunteers are encouraged however, we can only take a limited number of adults on each trip. Names will be on a 1st come basis but if we get a large number of parent requests, we will pick name at random. In most instances, we will try to take different parents each time.
