




Key Facts

Toys have been around for centuries. They are commonly used in play and can provide children with enjoyable means of training. Different materials like wood, clay, paper, and plastic are used to make toys.

- The earliest toys are made from materials found in nature, such as rocks, sticks, and clay.
- Children from rich families played with dolls, toy soldiers and tea sets.
- Early dolls in England were made of wood. The body and head were made of one piece of wood.
- After the 19th century, Jigsaw puzzles were made from printed paper which was glued onto wood and cut into shapes.
- Toys are displayed in many museums in the UK for children to look at. Pollock's museum is a famous museum in the UK.
