Dear Parents,

I hope you and your families are keeping well.

We had a wonderful celebration of the Queen's Jubilee on the last day of the half term.



As we get closer to the end of term I would like to share just a few reminders. The end of term is Thursday 21st of July. Children are expected to attend school to this final date of the academic year. In the final weeks of the term teaching and learning will obviously continue to take place as well as activities such as Sports days and school trips linked to curriculum learning.

May I also remind parents that we do not authorise any holidays during school term time. Children have missed out on being at school for long periods of time over the last 2 years. It is now important that they do not miss further days as a result of holidays booked during term time.

On the 12th July children will meet their new teacher for next academic year. They will spend the morning in their new class. Parents will be informed of their child's class and teacher in a letter sent home the same day. End of term reports will be sent home with children on Friday 15th July.

Next year children can continue to wear PE kits to school on PE lesson days. This ensures that we can make the most of time, focusing on the PE National Curriculum rather than losing valuable learning time whilst children are changing. It also means less loss of school uniform. However, from September we will be asking that children wear our school uniform PE kit.

Years 1 & 2

Year 1 really enjoyed visiting the farm and learning about the different animals. They remembered a lot of facts about animals from their science topic. They all said they loved feeding and touching the animals



In Year 2 this term, children have been observing the growth of their plants and have been amazed by their growth! They have been able to describe the changes and talk about their observations. The children are also looking forward to visiting the Welsh Harp to observe different habitats and animals.

Years 5 & 6

Year 5 are learning about Relationships in PSHE—as part of their transition to Year 6. In this topic, there is a focus on the use of social media looking at how it can positively enhance our lives, but equally cause hurt and sadness. We look at how we can maintain safety and be respectful of all people and communities. During this topic we will also teach the statutory requirement of puberty.

Year 6 visited the Tower of London on 15th and 16th July.

Pupils had a workshop focusing on the 'Secret Lives of Henry VIII's Wives'. Pupils learnt about the personalities and character traits of each wife, looking at how they made a "suitable" wife initially. It also showed how each wife met their end. Pupils also had a tour of the tower, looking at the Crown Jewels and seeing the 23, 578 gemstones used to decorate it.
