
Key Facts

Links to Previous Knowledge

In EYFS, under the Personal, social and emotional development ELG, the children learn to see themselves as a valuable individuals, build constructive and respectful relationships, express their feelings and consider the feelings of others, identify and moderate their own feelings socially and emotionally and think about the perspectives of others.

Key skills and concepts:

Children will be able to:

- Understand what similarities and differences are and be able to identify similarities and differences between themselves and their peers related to their hobbies, likes, dislikes, family composition, etc.
- Understand the difference between bullying (that occurs over time) and one off incidents and what to do if they are being bullied.
- Talk about the qualities and behaviours that make a good friend.
- Identify what makes them special and unique.
- Understand that we should be kind online as well as face-to-face
- Everyone has a family. There are lots of different types of family and they provide us with love and security.
