News

Welcome back! We hope you enjoyed your Winter holidays. The children worked very hard in the last term and are starting to acquire all the skills they need to progress in year 2. We have had some exciting enrichment opportunities with the children that have enhanced their learning and enjoyment such as the 1920s day.

Literacy

In Literacy we will begin the term with the story Man on the Moon (a day in the life of Bob). Children will be writing a description of the setting, a persuasive text and a report. After that, children will move on to a new story, The Whale Song. Children will be writing their own problems and solutions to this story.

Please ensure that children are reading every-day and that they are practising joining up their handwriting. If you need any resources for this, please do not hesitate to contact your class teacher.

Science

This half term our topic will be 'Growing Up' children will be learning about what babies need, how we change and doing an exciting growth investigation.

For this topic, we would like the children to bring in a baby picture of themselves so we can see the changes that have happened as they have grown.

Computing

Children will be learning about digital photography. They will learn to recognise that different devices can be used to take photographs and will gain experience capturing, editing, and improving photos. Finally, they will use this knowledge to recognise that images they see may not be real.

Art

In art this term we will be learning about colour with a focus on collage and colour. They will be looking at silhouettes from the Great Fire of London and using mixed media and colour to create a collage to represent the fire.

History

This term we will be learning about The Great Fire of London. Children will be learning about how the fire started, who was impacted and what happened afterwards. Children will also be sequencing artefacts, photographs and looking at the differences between now and then. For more information, please view the knowledge organiser on the website.

Music

Children will learn songs, play instruments and learning about musical terms such as beat, rhythm, pitch, high and low.

Maths

In year 2, children will need to learn their **2, 3, 5 and 10 multiplications**. They need to recall these at speed and learn the division facts to go with them. They will need to understand key vocabulary such as **groups of, equal groups** and **sharing**. Please support your child to learn these times tables. They will be learning about odd and even numbers where they will need to apply their knowledge of odd and even numbers to solve problems.

Children will also begin to learn about tally charts and pictograms.

RE

In RE children will learn about the topic **What makes us human**. They will explore the term **identity** and will think about what makes up a person. They will also be thinking about how our identify may change over time as we grow.

P.E

In P.E. children will be learning about dance and gymnastics. We will be linking actions to create a sequence and simple movement patterns. Children will be given the opportunity at the end of the unit to perform their own dances.

Great Fire of London



Research the Great Fire of London and create a story book.

Can you add illustrations to your story?
What are the key events that happened during this time?
How have things changed in London since then?

How have you changed?



Create a poster about yourself to explain how you have changed. You will need a photo of yourself when you were a baby and a photo of yourself today. Compare the photos and write about any changes you notice.

Think about:

What has changed physically?
Has anything stayed the same?
What has changed in what you like to do?
Why have these changes occurred?



Remember to make your poster bright and attractive so it stands out.
