News

Welcome back! We hope you enjoyed your Winter holidays. The children worked very hard in the last term and are starting to acquire all the skills they need to progress in year 2. We have planned some exciting enrichment opportunities to enhance the children's learning this term, such as a visit to the Tower of London and a library workshop.

Literacy

In Literacy we will begin the term with the story **Katie in London**. Children will be writing a diary entry describing how Katie felt about all of her experiences on her day trip to London. The children will take a trip to the Tower of London and hunt for the landmarks mentioned in the book. Following this, children will be writing their own problems and solutions to the story, The Whale Song.

Please ensure that children are reading to an adult everyday and that they are practising joining up their handwriting. If you need any resources for this, please do not hesitate to contact your child's class teacher.

Art

In art this term we will be learning about colour with a focus on collage and colour. They will be looking at silhouettes from the Great Fire of London and using mixed media and colour to create a collage to represent the fire.

History

This term we will be learning about <u>The Great Fire of London</u>. Children will be learning about how the fire started, who was impacted and what happened afterwards. Children will also be sequencing artefacts, photographs and looking at the differences between now and then. For more information, please view the knowledge organiser on the website. We will be going on a day trip to the Tower of London to enhance the learning in the topic of the Great Fire of London.

Music

In music, children will learn songs, continue to play recorders and learn about musical terms such as beat, rhythm, pitch, high and low.

PSHE

Our topic this term will be 'Healthy Me'. During this topic, children will learn what it means to have a healthy lifestyle, how medicines can help us and ways to stay calm and relaxed.

Science

This half term our topic will be 'Growing Up' children will be learning about what humans need to survive, how we change as we grow from a baby to an adult and conduct a growth investigation based on what we have learned.

For this topic, we would like the children to bring in a baby picture of themselves so we can look at the changes that have happened as they have grown.

Computing

Children will be learning about digital photography.

They will learn to recognise that different devices can be used to take photographs and will gain experience capturing, editing, and improving photos. Finally, they will use this knowledge to recognise that images they see may not be real.

Maths

In year 2, children will need to learn their **2**, **3**, **5** and **10** multiplications. They need to recall these at speed and learn the division facts to go with them. They will need to understand key vocabulary such as **groups of**, **equal groups** and **sharing**. Please support your child to learn these times tables. Education City is a useful website to support with this: Hit the Button - Quick fire maths practise for 6-11 year olds (topmarks.co.uk)

They will be developing their understanding of **odd and even** numbers and will apply their knowledge of odd and even numbers to solve problems.

Children will also explore **statistics** using tally charts and pictograms.

P.E

In P.E. children will be learning about dance and gymnastics. We will be linking actions to create a sequence and simple movement patterns. Children will be given the opportunity at the end of the unit to perform their own dances.
