Welcome back! We hope you enjoyed your half term holiday. The children worked extremely hard last term and are making good progress in their learning. This term we have a number of special events planned to enhance their learning experiences, such as Reading Week and Science Week.

English

In Literacy we will begin the term with work on traditional tales with 'The True Story of the Three Little Pigs.' We will then be studying a short film called 'The Dream Giver' in order to develop the children's inference and prediction. Finally, the children will learn about poetry. They will compare poems and look at features such as rhyming, alliteration and adjectives.

You can support your child by sharing books and stories from your own and other cultures. Also reading comics would be enjoyable reading for many of your children in addition to their colour banded reading books.

Art

In art children will be discussing the work of the artist Hokusai. They will create art with the mood and tone of the sea through the use of colour, texture and tone.

Geography

This term we will be learning about maps. The children will be learning to use geographical terms, to use maps and atlases and read the weather forecast. They will also have the opportunity to present their work orally through role-play, written or visually using ICT. You can support your child by discussing maps and journeys that you take as a family.

Music

Children have recently been introduced to recorders. They will continue to develop their skills using a range of techniques.

PSHE

Our topic this term will be 'Healthy Me'. During this topic, children will learn how to have a healthy lifestyle, how medicines can help us and ways to stay calm and relaxed.

Science

Our topic is 'The apprentice gardener'' WE will be looking at how plants grow and change over time by observing them and looking for patterns within plant growth. Some of the questions will will be exploring are How should we plant seeds? What happens to seeds as they grow? We will investigate germination and does it matter how we plant our seeds. The children will have opportunities to have hands on experience and grow their own seeds.

Computing

Pupils will learn about safe internet searching. They will be using an internet browser and search engines, as well as finding information to create a presentations. You can support your child by helping them to use the internet safely and helping them to select reliable information.

Maths

We will be learning about fractions and we will be looking at how to find one half, one quarter and one third. Our work on measures will include using a ruler to measure in centimetres and metres and solving measures problems. We will also learn about capacity (ml/l) and mass (g/kg). Doing some baking with the children will help their understanding of these concepts. We will then revisit addition and subtractions strategies and using the inverse operation. Children will then be learning about position and direction, including clockwise and anti-clockwise, quarter, half and three-quarter turns.

P.E

In PE, children have been learning different invasion games such as football and netball.




Create a 'Recipe for a Rights Respecting School' where all children are treated fairly.
