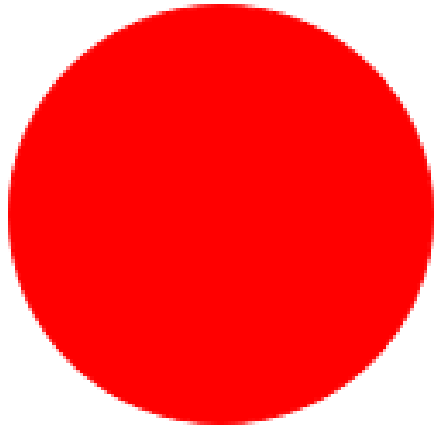

Greater than and Less than

Problem of the day

What is the name of this shape?



Learning objective

To compare amounts using key vocabulary.

What does Greater than mean?

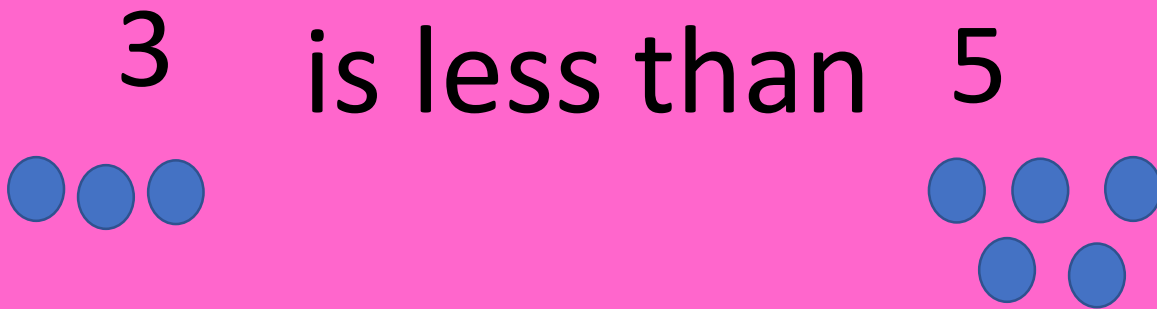
It means **BIGGER THAN.**

What does less than mean?

It means SMALLER THAN.

We can compare two numbers using greater than and less than.

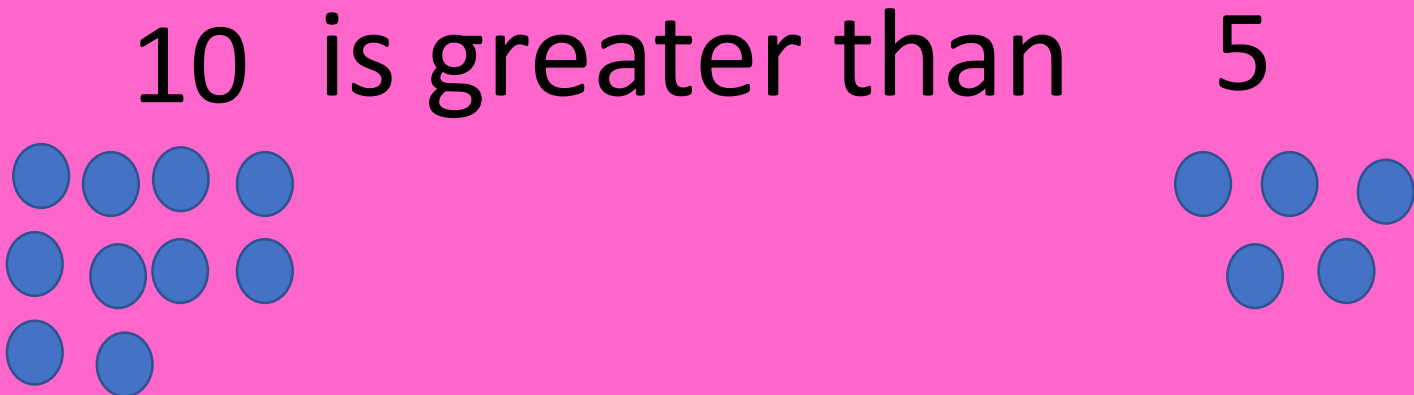
3 is LESS THAN 5 because 3 is smaller than 5.



Always compare the first number/amount to the second number/amount when comparing.

We can compare two numbers using greater than and less than

10 is GREATER THAN 5 because 10 is bigger than 5.



Always compare the first number/amount to the second number/amount when comparing.
