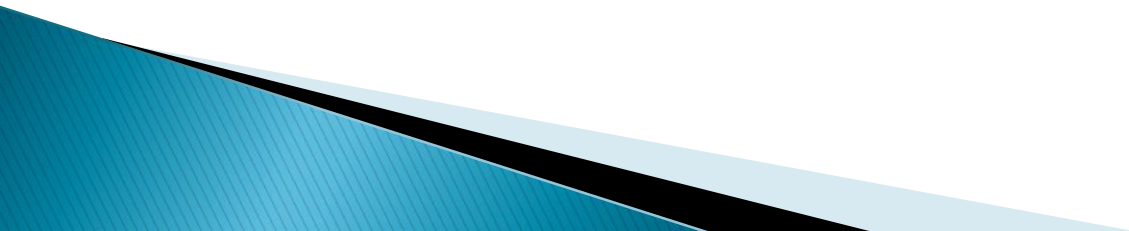
Problem of the day

To find one more of a given number.

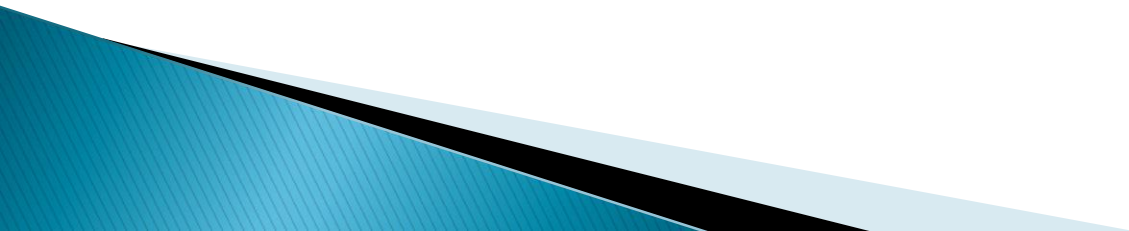


What does one more mean?

For example:

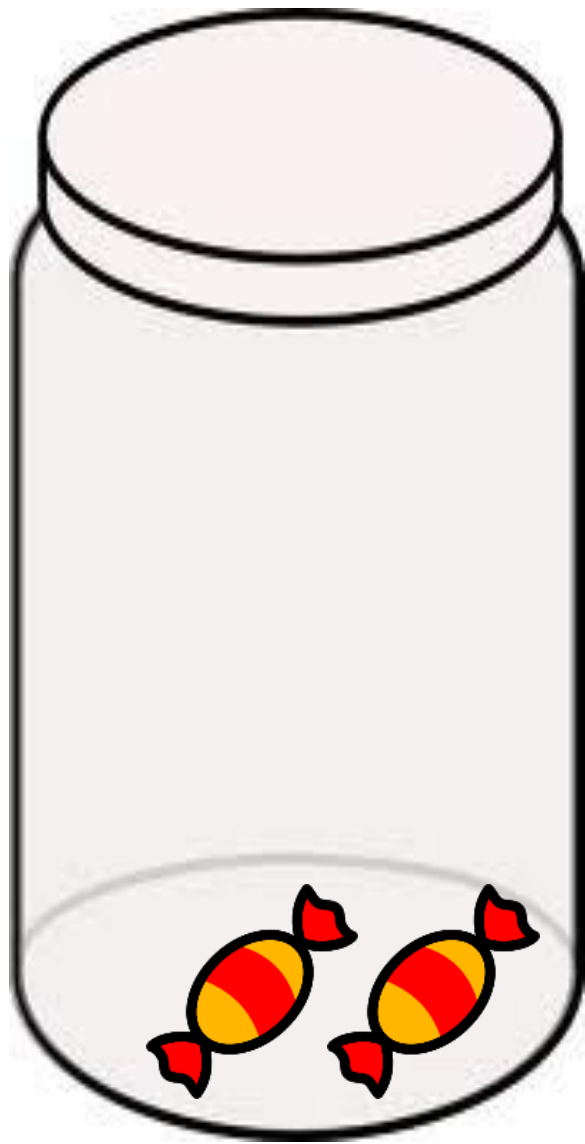
One more than 7 is 8.

If there are 5 apples and I add one more, there will be 6 apples.



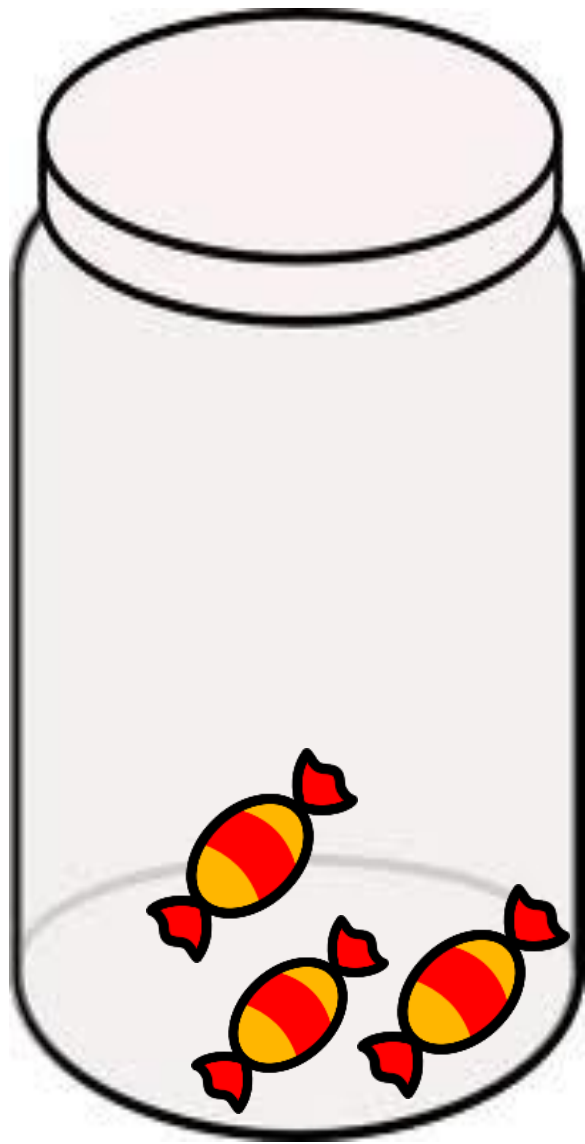

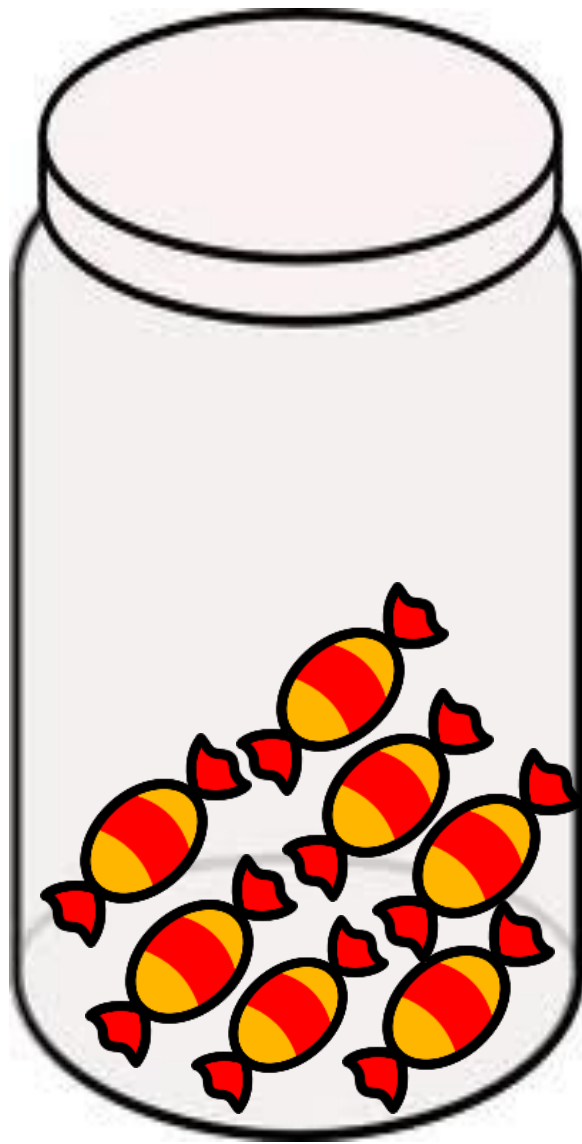
2 sweets in a jar

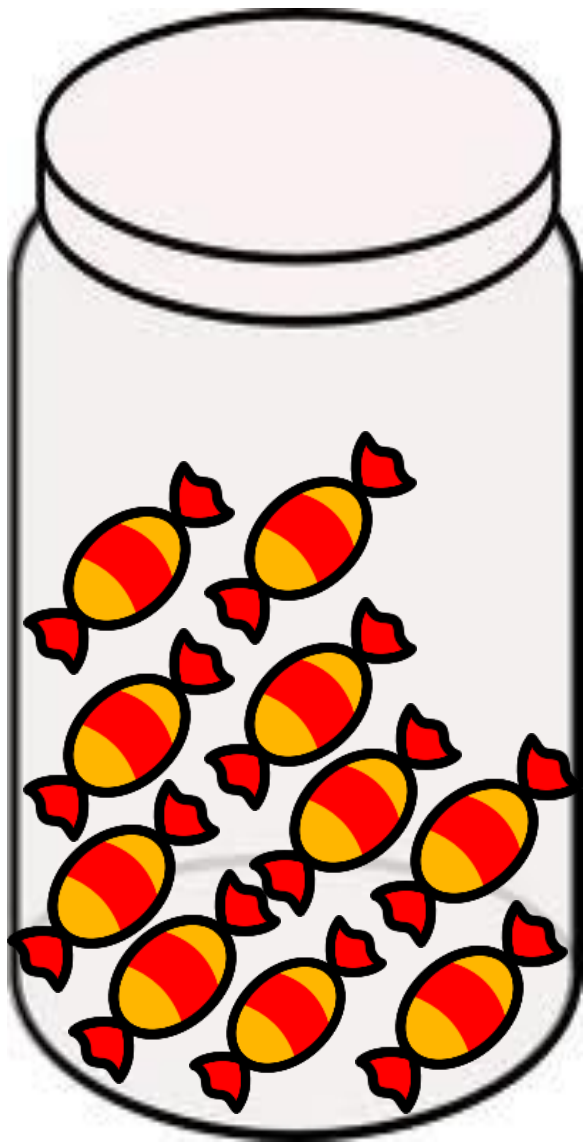
