

L.O: To make inferences using artefacts

Today we are going to be visiting a museum, looking at a range of artefacts!

Why do historians use artefacts especially pots?

Greek pots are important because they tell us so much about how life was in ancient Greek cities.

Pots came in all sorts of shapes and sizes depending on their purpose, and were often beautifully decorated with pictures of daily life.

Sometimes these pictures reflect what the pot was used for.

With your parent or older sibling, piece together the artefact and discuss...

What do you notice about their shapes?

What pictures are painted onto them?

What does this tell us about Ancient Greek life?

Greek pots also tell us about some of the things the Greeks did for us- what do you think is happening on this pot and why?
